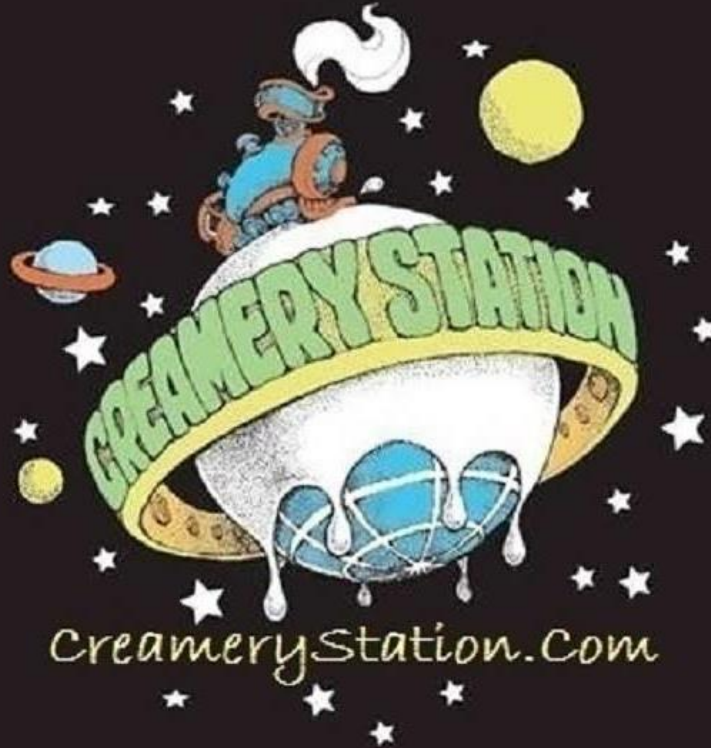

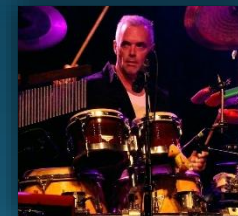

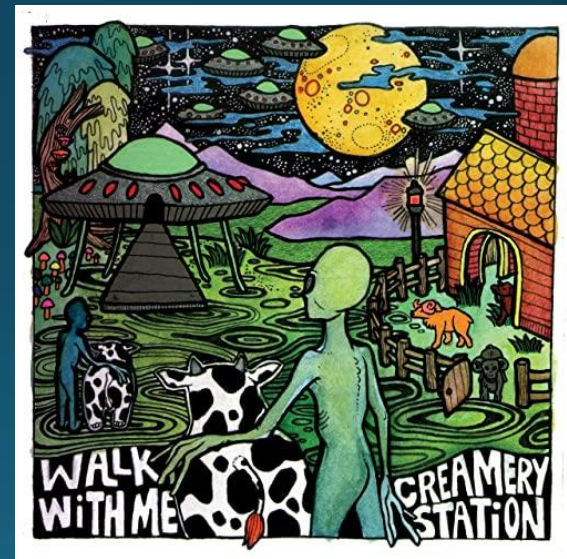

Max Creek and Creamery Station - American Beauty New York, NY

What a night it was at
American Beauty last Friday!

Making their New York City debut at the famed bar and venue was Creamery Station, a family band from Connecticut that reminded us why we love this music so much. A seven-piece band (eight if you include their mascot Jerry the Alien), traded off solos in true hoedown fashion with deep jams that showed the band's originality and creativity.

Featured on many solos throughout the night was harmonica player Don Destefano who kept the room on fire. Jim Kadar, the band's only guitarist, is one of the most impressive I have ever seen. He kept a sophisticated balanced between heavy solo rifts and sexy rhythm styles; there wasn't any limitation. With a set list mixed with covers, originals, and a bit of hijinks, Creamery Station played a wide range of sounds. Keyboard player Jon Truelson sang a beautiful version of "It Makes no Difference" in the middle of the set to change it up and melt hearts instead of faces. Another memorable moment came when Creamery Station busted out a "West L.A. Fadeaway" to remember. In the deep jam after the second verse, the band really opened up and explored a complex range of grooves which then transitioned into an instrumental version of the Rolling Stones' "Miss You," then transitioning back into "West L.A. Fadeaway." The crowd was stunned and dancing off the walls with this one.

Having a robust percussion section really made these tight jams possible featuring Harry Cooper on drums and Michael Ryan on percussion; Dan Raucci on bass kept his fingers moving all night and was featured in a sick rhythm section solo that kept everyone dancing well into the set. . But the highlight of the night came when the mandolin player and singer, Dylan Kader, the frontman apparent of the group, joined the crowd with his instrument and danced and played on the floor. Having a wireless amp hook-up made this possible as he added the funky and sometimes mysterious sounds we all love from the mandolin, adding a rich element to the band's sound with solos and tight rhythm. You haven't heard a mandolin featured in a band like this before. At one point Kader even climbed into the famous dancing cages mounted on the walls of American Beauty, sharing the cage with the aforementioned mascot Jerry the Alien. The crowd was fun and the band killed it.

"There was a lot of wind and with the amount of tent and tarp in our vicinity I caught what I call some Wormtown sleep. One minute sleep, wake up, one minute sleep, wake up, repeat. So I got up in the 8 AM hour or so just tied of the battle. I unzipped the front of the booth tent and was hanging out, when a kindly bearded gentlemen came up to me, handed me a flier, and said that his band Creamery Station was playing at 10A, would have free coffee and a creamery station. Brilliant! So I caught my first show with Creamery Station shortly thereafter!..."

...Interestingly the band is made up of two generations of dudes- three guys who appear to be about 25-30 years old, and three guys who appear to be hovering somewhere around 50 years old. There is no separation necessarily of the old guys are better, or the young guys have more energy- they blend together really well and are a perfect supplement to the Camp Creek vibe- with Max Creek having their own duo-generational reality going."

"Creamery Station's early afternoon Friday set at the River Worm Stage was definitely one to remember. With a swift breeze under a canopy of maple leaves, the River Worm Stage offered a sanctuary from the 90 degree heat felt elsewhere. Promptly at 2:20pm, the familiar sound of Don DeStefano's harmonica in the opening horns of "Whammer Jammer" started the tone of the show, defined by a mixture of blues, soul, and jam..."

...Creamery Station's focus turned to the talented Jim Kader in the soulful Allman Brother's tune "Ain't Wasting Time No More", which ended in a cheering ovation of gratitude by the crowd. At this point, with time winding down, the band started what they thought would be the last song of the set, the famous Jerry Garcia tune "Sisters and Brothers". With Dylan Kader on vocals, it was evident that this deep jam really tugged at the heartstrings of the fans.

After this tune, the crowd was heard chanting, "One more song, one more song..." To the delight of the fans, the sound crew signaled the band they had time for one more! In Dylan Kader's pre-song banter, he indicated to the crowd that he was going to change it up a little bit by saying, "You know, our hometown is a small farm town in Bethany, Connecticut. So here is a little farm music to get your feet-a-moving." Creamery ended the set with a wild bluegrass rendition of Woody Guthrie's "Crawdad song!"

Connecticut isn't known to pump out world renowned musicians like New York, Seattle and California do, so it's refreshing to see a group of guys emerge from the backwoods of the state with some true talent and passion for the art. Over the past three years, Creamery Station has been cooking up a collection that's surprisingly good.

Creamery says they're a combination of the Grateful Dead, Allman Brothers, The Band, Little Feat, Railroad Earth, David Grisman, Doc Watson, Jimi Hendrix, Stevie Ray Vaughan and their first album is a fantastic representation of all these legendary groups. They manage to sound unique while giving glimpses of the defining characteristics of their inspiration rather than a copy of them. Some songs sound more familiar than others, but this is their first compilation and it's thoroughly impressive.

They started from humble beginnings as a small band playing for a few house parties and slowly grew to a full seven-man group that brings a classic and a universally enjoyable country/jam sound to the stage. They are based in CT but are making their way to New York City for the very first time and are definitely worth checking out.

Dylan Kader, of Bethany, Connecticut, primarily sings and plays mandolin in Creamery Station, but is known to periodically play guitar and percussion. With his father, Jim Kader, being a musician, he was surrounded by music from an early age and grew up at his father's gigs as a part of the live music scene - then later continued his cultivation of this way of life by following jam bands across the nation on wild journeys that are often the focal points of his songs. These bands became huge inspirations for Dylan's playing. Some of his favorite bands and serious influences on Creamery Station are The Dead, The Allman Brothers, The Band, Little Feat, Railroad Earth, Max Creek, and so much more.

After learning how to play guitar from his father, Dylan continued to expand his musical knowledge by learning from a plethora of teachers such as his music theory professor at University of Bridgeport Dr. Jeffery Johnson, his vocal teacher, Berklee Graduate Jon Truelson, and his mandolin teacher, bluegrass extraordinaire Dick Neal. As a culmination of all of these teachings, Dylan has begun to compose original material that has been garnering attention from a multitude of outlets. The primary outlet being his main musical project, Creamery Station. With their recent emergence on the New England jam scene being dubbed as one of the fastest rising jam bands in Connecticut, Dylan has devoted almost all of his time and efforts to the project and has been writing new material and refining his chops whenever they are not playing out.

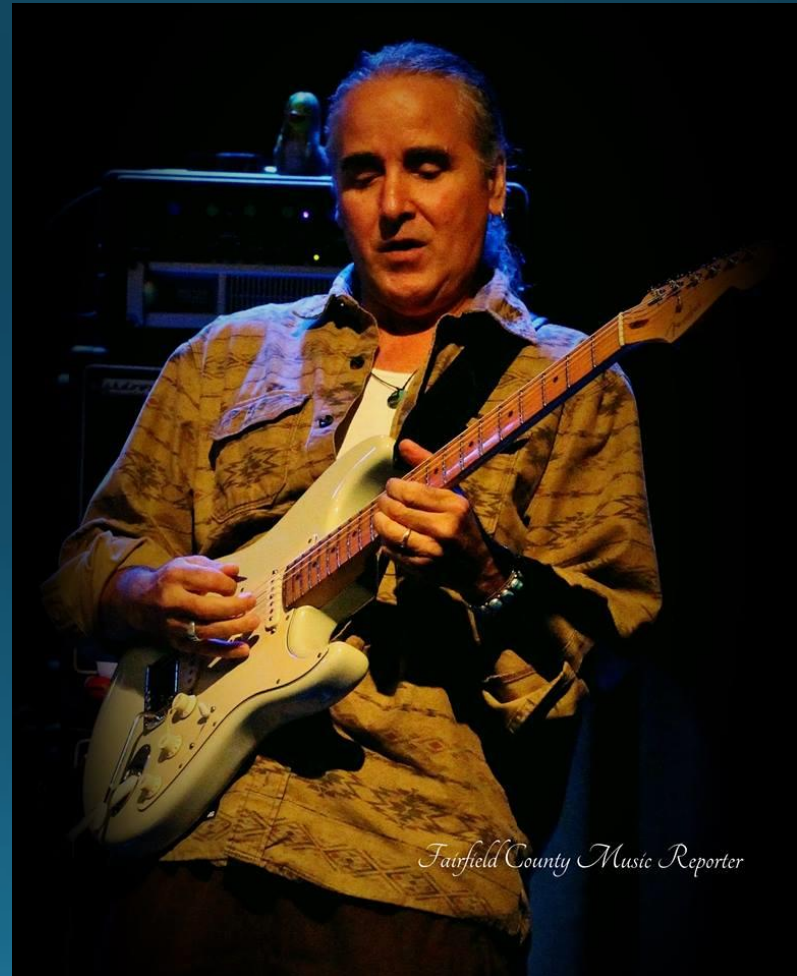
Jim Kader Guitar

Don DeStefano - Harmonicas

Don "Don D." DeStefano Born with the full name Donald Walter DeStefano, sharing the same middle name as legendary blues harp virtuoso Marion "Little Walter" Jacobs, Don may have well been destined to play the harmonica. Picking up the instrument as a teenager, he didn't seriously study the harmonica until attending college in the Midwest, when he came under the spell of the Chicago blues style, observing such legends as Junior Wells and Big Walter Horton who were still actively gigging in the Windy City during the 70's.

Don's harmonica style is a musical gumbo inspired by traditional blues legends, such as Little Walter, Rice Miller, Walter Horton and the modern blues/rock and R&B/soul practitioners; Paul Butterfield, Lee Oskar, Magic Dick, Stevie Wonder, Norton Buffalo, and legendary Nashville recording session, country and bluegrass harmonica virtuoso, Charlie McCoy...and his playing is also heavily influenced by many R&B horn players such as King Curtis, Junior Walker, Maceo Parker, and Grover Washington Jr.

Don has performed across the four corners of North America, from Alaska to the Canadian Maritimes, southern California to the Caribbean, and points in between. In addition to performing steadily over the past 30+ years and sharing the stage with such notable musicians as, Mark Naftalin (of the Paul Butterfield Band), Eric Von Schmidt, and Jimmy Vivino & Mike Merrit (of the Max Weinberg 7) and opening for many major artists including Robert Cray, the Fabulous Thunderbirds, Peter Wolf, Greg Rolie Band (of Santana) and Rick Derringer, Don also has been active as a studio musician, recording on several commercial jingles and songwriter demos. His harmonica and slide guitar playing were featured a few years back on recordings by two of America's musical icons: bluesman B.B. King and country star Johnny Cash. His harmonica playing has also been featured on CD releases by Peter Gale ("Landlord Of Love"), Gershwin's Roommate ("Walking On Water Wasn't Built In A Day"), jazz vocalist Sally O'Brien's ("Passion"), the collaboration CD (The Cutting Room Sessions) by two of St. Thomas, US Virgin Islands most popular music entertainers, Becca Darling & Barefoot Davis, along with Davis's newest release (Barefoot Dreamin') and the recently released single, (Wicked Man Rail) by Connecticut based, power funk/rock trio, Solistic. Don also appeared as an on-air guest, along with internationally renowned harmonica virtuoso, Howard Levy, on a radio broadcast dedicated to the harmonica, "Harmonica Heroes Take Over WNPR" on the nationally syndicated Colin McEnroe Show on WNPR Public Radio. In addition, he has reprised the legendary harmonica performance of Paul Butterfield in the critically acclaimed Martin Scorsese concert movie by The Band, "The Last Waltz", as a performer with the musical re-creation "Last Waltz Live." In addition to his performing and recording credits, his willingness to share his knowledge on all things "harmonica", Don has also written numerous articles on harmonica repair and customization, and amplifier modification for harmonica use in several print and online publications.



Don is an endorser of and sponsored by Seydel Harmonicas, the worlds oldest harmonica manufacturer.

Besides performing and recording, Don teaches beginning, intermediate, and advanced students the fundamentals of the diatonic harmonica (blues harp) and will cover genres such as folk, blues, rock, country, R&B, and bluegrass. Techniques such as chording, scales, note bending, alternate tunings and positions, and music theory as it is applied to the harmonica. An introduction to beginning blues chromatic harmonica for intermediate and advanced students. Don has been teaching harmonica for 20 years.

Michael Ryan is a veteran of the live music scene with over 3000 live performances spanning his career with highlights that range from clubs/pubs in over 28 States and 5 countries to 7 concerts at the famed Shea Stadium. His versatility on both the drum kit and percussion has enabled him to play and record in most all genres of music. Michael began playing at the age of 7 and studied under famed drummer/vibraphone player Dave Zimnicki of The Yellowjackets. At age 18 he auditioned and was accepted into the U.S. Army Band where he spent 8 years performing as the primary percussionist in the each of his unit's Corp, Symphony, Big Band and Jazz ensembles the highlight being able to play in the prestigious Presidential escort for then President Ronald Reagan and Mikhail Gorbachev in Iceland. After his career in the Army, Michael began performing with notable blues artists including Guitar Gabriel, James Montgomery, Clarence 'Gatemouth' Brown as well as a steady diet of bar bands to cut his teeth in live music scene.

Michael then moved south to Tennessee for 8 year where he was performing 120-200 shows a year in various groups of all styles, most favorably with the Jam Band/Fusion/Prog Rock scene where he honed his skills opening for groups such as The Allman Brothers, Moe, Galactic, Blues Traveler, Dr John, Gov't Mule, Col Bruce Hampton and the Aquarium Rescue Unit and the Dixie Dreggs. While in Knoxville, Michael was honored to perform with Smithsonian Jazz Legend Donald Brown of the famed Art Blakey and the Jazz Messengers.

Upon moving back to his home state of CT in 1999 Michael began playing in the Celtic music scene where he spent 14 years behind the kit for the wildly popular Celtic rock band, The Highland Rovers. Michael has recorded on close to 35 CD/albums in his career and has had numerous TV and movie appearances as a musician. Above all, his love of live music has driven him to explore and hone his percussive craft as he continues to learn new styles and techniques with each new musical venture.



Michael continues a schedule of playing drums and percussion for multiple artists, performs 120- 200 a year. When he is not pounding the percussion with Creamery Station, Michael performs or has played with such artists as: The Highland Rovers, Jeff Conlon, Americelt, The Neybas, Someone You can Xray, The John Spignesi Band, CK3, Jen Durkin, Bobby Morrill and many, many more

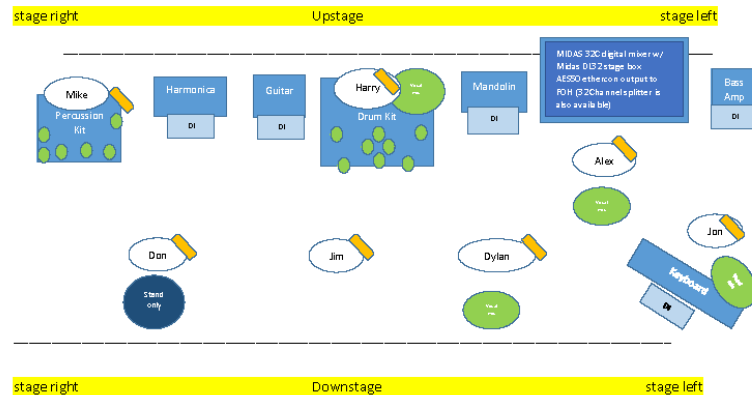
